*Two Questions to ask when I'm praying:

- What does the Bible say about prayer?
- What does the Bible say about the things I'm praying about?
- * Pray the prayer Jesus gave you- Matthew 6:9-13 (The Lord's Prayer)
 - A model, not a script
 - What elements do you need to incorporate into your prayer life?
- * Draw from the heart of prayer in the Psalms
 - The Psalms contain longing, wrestling, faith, crying out to God
 - Prayer elements: adoration, thanksgiving, lament, confession, request
- * What examples of prayer from Scripture can you relate to?
 What people in the Bible?
 What prayers in the Bible?

2- BIBLE READING >>>> PRAYER

(From inhaling to exhaling)

Places to start this month: Try James. Or one of Matthew, Mark, Luke or John

*Prayer-questions to ask when I am reading my Bible:

- i- How do these verses move me to express my awe and love for God?
- ii- How do these verses move me to express my gratitude towards God?
- iii- What do these verses prompt me to confess to God?
- iv- Who do these verses encourage me to pray for?
- v- "God, how do you want me to live this out?"
- vi- What will I say back to God about what he said to me through his Word?

3- FORM A BREATH PRAYER FROM SCRIPTURE

(A way to to more deeply engage in a sincere and repeated prayer)

"Speak Lord... for your servant hears."

"The Lord is my shepherd... I shall not want." "I cease striving... and know that you are God."

"God be merciful to me... a sinner."

"Live by the Spirit... Keep in step with the Spirit."

"In Christ's humility... Consider others better than yourselves"


